Activity 1: Rainbow craft

Supplies Provided in this Packet: Cotton balls, half paper plate

Things needed at home: Glue, coloring utensils

Directions: On the inside of the plate color a rainbow, put the colors in order. An example will be down below if you don't know what order to put them in. On each side, place 3 cotton balls; you can leave them whole, or spread them out. Please e-mail me a photo. The first two submitted projects will receive a glow stick.



Activity 2: Marshmallow Blaster

Supplies Provided in this Packet: Balloon, Marshmallows, fabric to cover the tissue paper roll

Things needed at home: Tissue Roll, Scissors, Rubber Band

Directions: Cover the tissue paper roll with the fabric and glue it down. Tie the end of the balloon and cut just a small hole at the top of the balloon. Attach the balloon's open side to one end of the tissue paper roll. Use the rubber band to secure it. Drop a marshmallow inside and try to blast it!

Activity: Planting popcorn seeds

Supplies Provided in this Packet: Seeds, and soil

Things needed at home: A ground to plant in and water

Directions: We have provided you with a cup of soil for you to plant one seed inside the cup so you can see the plant grow inside. After the seed begins to sprout you will eventually need to move it to the ground so it can grow properly. Find a nice planting space in your yard. Dig two holes 2 inches deep and 8 inches apart. Then drop 3 seeds in each hole and use the original soil to cover the seeds. If your yard does not have proper growing soil then you may have to purchase some. Popcorn seeds need a least 2 inches of water a week. If you would like more seeds to plant just ask for Ms. Cheri at the Boys and Girls Club or simply e-mail me at the address above.

(Your 7 seeds will be aluminum foil inside your cup)

Step 1: Fill in the facts about Koala Bears.

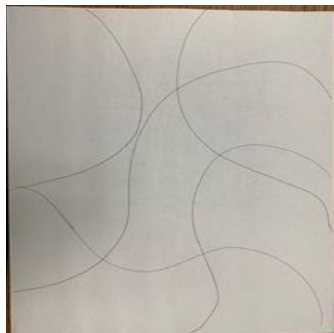
Step 2: Color the picture.

Activity 2: Build your own Koala Bear

Goal: Following Directions

Supplies provided in this packet:

Two clothes pins, 1 toilet paper roll, gray construction paper for ears and body

Things needed from home:

Paint – mix black and white to make gray, black marker, glue, scissors

Directions:

Step 1: Paint your toilet paper roll gray to give you that lovely Koala gray. Let your toilet paper roll dry completely.

Step 2: Cut out two ears and a tummy out of the gray construction paper.

Step 3: Per the photo below, squeeze the top of your toilet paper roll together and push the sides in at the same time. This will shape your toilet paper roll Koala's head.

Step 4: Insert the ears into the sides that you pushed in. Apply lots of glue to ears and the top of the head and secure with clothes pins. Let dry.

Step 5: Glue the tummy. Use the black magic marker to draw the eyes, nose, and mouth.

Indoor/Outdoor Hockey

Supplies Provided: N/A

Things needed at home: Balloon(s), Cardboard to make your own mini hockey stick (or fly swatter) Clothes basket/boxes to use a goal.

Set-Up: Have mom or dad create your hockey sticks, set up two goals, and inflate a couple of balloons.

Get Started!:

It's time to play Indoor Hockey... This is a modified game of hockey... No physical play, high sticking (wildly swinging the hockey sticks). Rock, Paper, Scissor to see who goes first. Place the balloon at the "Center Ice" (midpoint between both goals) and the first player will use the "hockey sticks" to alternate taking turns slapping the balloon toward your goal. When a player has successfully knocked the balloon into their goal, they have scored a point.

The player to score 10 goals is the winner.

The game can be modified to be played outdoors as well using the same concept and rules.

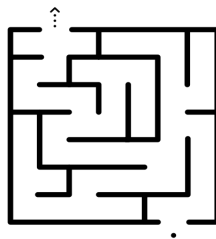


Activity: Maze Runner Board

Supplies Provided in this packet: Cardboard, glue, yarn,

Things needed at home: Ruler or straight edge, pencil, ping pong ball from previous packet. If you have lost your ball or never received one simply ask one of the packet distributors for one.

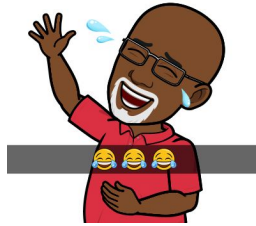
Directions: Lightly draw a maze on the cardboard. You want to draw it as light as possible just in case you may need to erase a line. Once you have completed the maze, take your finger and trace through it making sure you have a beginning and an ending. If you have, cut the yarn into small strips the size of each line and glue the line to the board on the lines. Then let dry. Once your board is set. Use the ping pong and maneuver through the maze by holding the maze on each side and not touching the ball. If the ball crosses a line you must start over! Send Coach Breezy a picture of your maze. Best one wins a collection of sports balls!

Activity: Penny Shoot/ Penny hockey

Supplies provided: Styrofoam cup

Things needed at home: Penny, scissors

Directions: These games can be played with one player trying to hit the targets or against each other in a game similar to hockey. Using the scissors cut the cup into two equal halves creating goals or targets. If you are playing Penny Shoot, place the cups at different depths trying to flick the penny in the targets for points. If it's hockey you are playing, you and your opponent should simply sit at the opposite side of a table each with a goal. Take turns trying to flick the penny into your opponent's goal!
