## SUMMER PROGRAM

Program is for current K-12th graders (2025-2026 school year). Children must be five years old by August 31, 2025 AND have completed traditional Kindergarten.

Breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack are provided for each child and are included in the price of the program.

All field trips and day trips to Camp Spencer (camp for Elementary Students) are included in the price of the program.

## SUMMER HOURS

Summer Program hours are Monday-Friday, 7:30am - 6:30pm. Doors will not open before 7:30am. Neglecting these operating hours may result in your child being suspended from the program.

The Summer Program begins June 1 and ends July 31. The Club will be closed June 19 & July 3.

## DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

CHILD DROP-OFF is permitted between 7:30am and 9am only. After 9am, parents must park and walk their child inside to check in at Club Central with a lunch. Cars are not allowed to park in the drop-off lane. (Breakfast cutoff is 8:30am).

CHILD PICK-UP Parent / driver must park in a designated parking spot and come inside to Club Central, located through the left door under the covered drop-off area

## MEDICATION

The Club does not have medical personnel on staff. Club staff will dispense medication to a child only with the written consent of the parent.

## ACTIVITY ROOMS

Activity Rooms are divided into Junior (K-2) and Senior (3-5) wings. Each wing includes: Learning Center, Games Room, Multi-Purpose Room and Technology Center. Children also have access to 3 Gymnasiums and an E-Sports Room. Teens have designated rooms, outfitted with computers, televisions, video games, books and board games.

## THE DAILY ROUTINE

- 7:30am - 8:30am Children must report to either the cafeteria for breakfast or to their designated homeroom upon arrival.
- 9:15am-6:30pm Children follow an activity schedule
- 11:45pm-1:45pm \*Lunch
- 3:45pm-4:30pm Afternoon snack

\*Lunches are served during one of four 30 minute time frames.

## MEALS

During the Summer Program, a breakfast and lunch are provided, free of charge, through the USDA Summer Food Service Program. An afternoon snack is also provided through the Second Harvest Food Bank. Children are permitted to bring lunch or snacks from home. Club does not provide substitute foods to offset allergies.

## PERSONAL ITEMS

The Club will not take responsibility for lost or stolen items. Valuables such as audio devices, handheld games, etc. are prohibited. Students may possess cell phones but are not permitted to access them while at the Club.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

The Club Code of Conduct is included in registration materials and the Program Parent Guides. The Club takes the Code very seriously, and reserves the authority to enforce it in the best interest of the Club.

Members are divided into four units. Members will be subdivided into groups based on grade. All units follow an activity schedule under the supervision of Club Staff.

- Junior Unit (Kindergarten-Grade 2)
- Senior Unit (Grades 3-5)
- Middle School Unit (Grades 6-8)
- High School Unit (Grades 9-12)

## FIELD TRIPS / CAMP SPENCER

CAMP T.N. SPENCER PARK is a Cabarrus County park and is open to the public during the operating hours of the Summer program. With the exception of the pool, areas of the park that are being used by the Club are off limits to the public. The Park's pool will be open to the public at all times.
