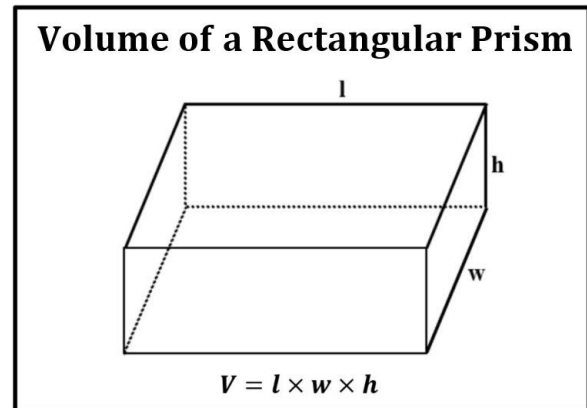

When creating your tower, you must first decide the shapes that you want to make. You will need to count the blocks where you make the fold and repeat the process around the paper (if you fold the bottom at block number 7, you will do the same at each side). After you have completed this step, you will need to go back and cut out the corners. This will help you to tape the sides together better.

Remember

The bigger the shape you choose to create, the more paper you will need to use for that one shape!

Each block will have its own volume. Remember the formula for calculating volume is

Length x width x height ($l \times w \times h$)

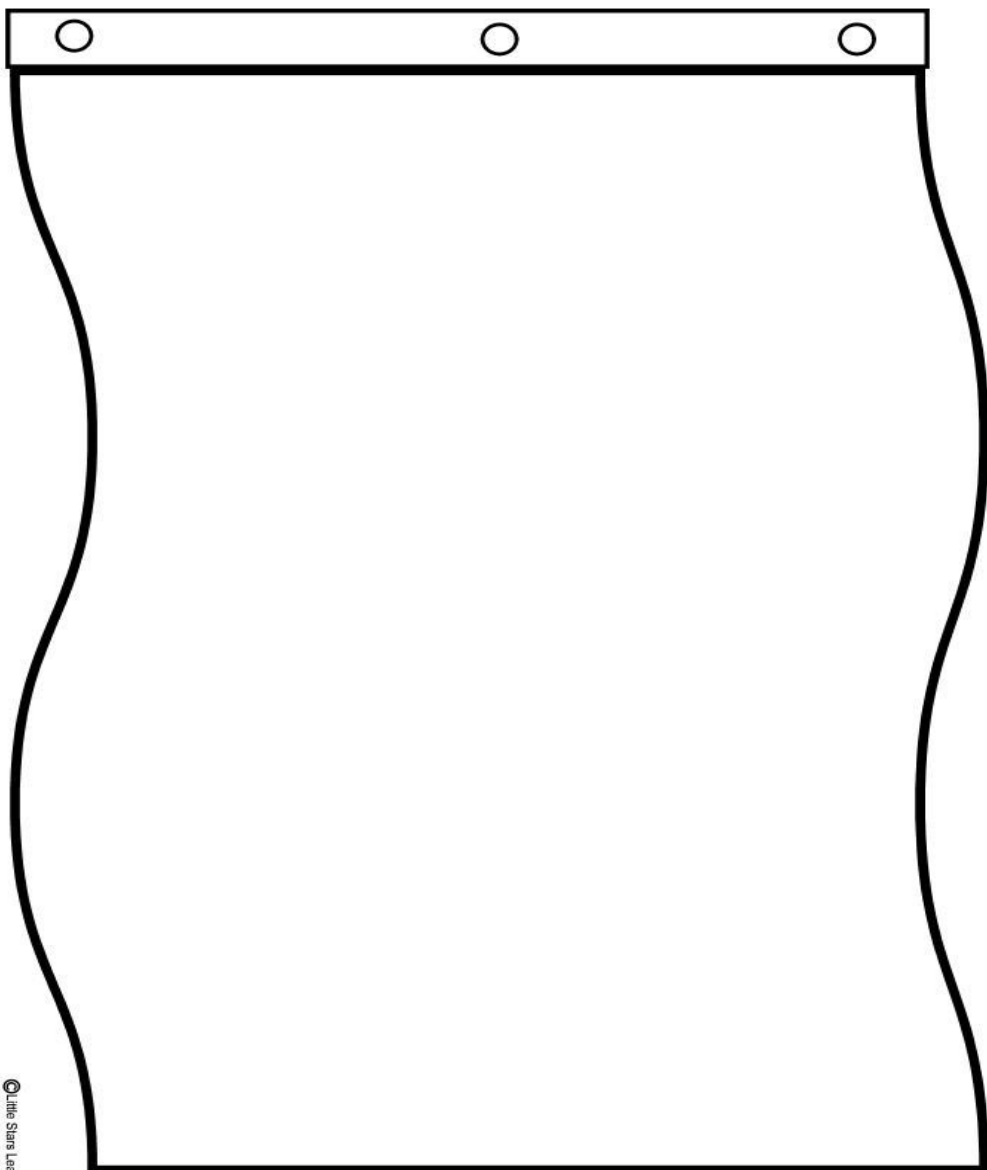
Things needed at home:

Supplies Provided in this Packet:

Pony Beads

String

Aluminum Foil

Things Needed at Home:

Oven/ Safety/ Parent Supervision

Directions:

1. Decide how you are going to design the letters of your name. You can do cursive, Times New Roman, Disney style, ANY style is cool and is completely up to you!
2. Arrange the beads how you would like them on the string.
3. Place the completed letters on the foil (unless you are keeping your name all together).
4. Place the foil onto a cookie sheet. PREHEAT OVEN TO 400 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT. Once the oven is preheated, put the beads in the oven for 8 to 11 minutes. ASK A PARENT FOR GUIDANCE. Note: Due to Plastic Melting, there will be a burning odor!
5. Check on your beads periodically to make sure they are actually melting together!
6. Once the time is up, remove from the oven and let cool. Note: You can also put the art in the freezer for faster cooling!
7. Place your name in your room for display.
